## GMT / Dual Time Mechanical

## User's manual English

## General information

GMT watches have two hour hands that show the time at your place of origin and your destination simultaneously.

The additional hour hand is not read via the dial with its 12 hourly markers, but rather using a separate hour scale (i.e. on the dial or bezel), which has a 24 -hour marking. So you read the time either 'inside' or 'outside' the dial, depending on the time you wish to know.

To simplify the reading of the other local time, the second hour hand has a different appearance.

## \#1 Display: Watch hands



Display of local time (f. i. Reykjavik 10 p.m.) by means of hour (A) and minute (B) hand; a second time zone (f. i. New York 6 p.m.) can be selected by means of the additional hand (C), which completes one revolution in

24 hours. A rotable universal time ring (D) (optional), which is set to the 24 hour hand (C), allows to read the time of any other time zone (f. i. Paris 12 p.m.).

## \#2 Settings: Crown 3 positions



Normal running of watch and the hand-winding

Rapid correction of date indicator and the 24 hours hand

Correcting time position with stop second

Self-winding of the watch by the movements of the wrist.
